

Kicheche Camps 2011

In hand with our ongoing commitment to the Conservancies of the Masai Mara eco-system we are pleased to announce a repositioning of some camps effective June 2011.

- **Kicheche Mara Camp** will be downsized to eight tents and relocated to a wonderful site in Acacia Valley, where our seasonal Little Kicheche site operated from, in – Mara North Conservancy.
- **Kicheche Naboisho Camp**, We are pleased to support the expansion of the Masai Mara eco-system by being an underwriting tourist partner in this newly established Conservancy. Our camp is scheduled to open in June 2011 and will consist of six tents ensuring the classic personal touch in camp and a whole new area of the Mara to explore whilst game driving or walking.
- **Kicheche Bush Camp** will continue to operate its six tents as normal in the exclusive Olare Orok/ Motorogi Conservancy.
- **Kicheche Laikipia Camp** will also continue to operate its six tents as normal in Ol Pejeta Conservancy.

Why Conservancies?

We sincerely believe that well managed Conservancies not only give our guests a top quality safari experience but they also provide a secure guaranteed income for the Masai landowners and ensure the long term survival of the Greater Mara eco-system.

- No more than 3 cars at any one sighting (5 cars in MNC)
- Controlled cattle grazing reduces predator conflict, provides a valuable grass management tool and is an important resource for our Masai partners.
- A high quality management team ensures a strict code of conduct is followed, poaching is kept at bay and provides general security for the area.
